Specimen Requirements:

**Patient Preparation:** 

Collect: <u>Plain red or serum</u> separator tube (SST)).

Specimen Preparation: Separate serum from cells ASAP or within 2 hours of collection.

Transfer 0.5 mL serum to an ARUP <u>standard transport</u> <u>tube.Standard Transport Tube.</u> (Min: 0.252 mL). Refer to
